3. Have you ever feared a move you had to make to another place? How did God comfort and guide you?

Digging Deeper

4. What concerns Jacob as he prepares to leave Canaan and meet the long-lost Joseph? How does God speak to these concerns?

5. How was Jacob's preparation and meeting with Joseph like, and unlike, his long awaited reunion with Esau?

6. How does the reunion of Joseph and his father Jacob, after 22 years apart, bring joy as well as brokenness?

7. At the beginning of chapter 47 what is so significant about Jacob finally meeting Pharaoh? What is so significant about Jacob blessing Pharaoh?

8. Looking ahead to Exodus 1:7, how does Joseph set the stage for prosperity?

9. The first-born son is not always the one who receives the blessing in our study of Genesis. What does this teach you about how God chooses his servants?

10. Why does Jacob make Joseph promise to bury him in Canaan? Does it matter to you where you might be laid to rest?

11. To Pharaoh, Jacob describes his own life as a pilgrimage. What metaphor would you use to describe your life? (a race, a battle, a puzzle, etc.)
