5. What might you have been thinking if you were one of John’s disciples at this point? Based on this account, how would you have felt about John if you were Jesus’ disciple?

6. How would you describe John the Baptist’s response to all of this in verses 27-36?

7. What does John mean in verse 27? What is John acknowledging in this verse?

8. What is the point of the allegory about the bride and groom that John the Baptist uses in verse 29? How does John see his role in Jesus’ overall ministry?

9. What is the import of John’s words in verse 30? Why are they so full of meaning for all of us?

10. What facts about Jesus does John bring out in verses 31-36?

11. In verse 36, how does the phrase “rejecting the Son” stand in contrast to what belief really means?
