Getting Started

1. What insight, principle, or observation from this weekend’s message did you find to be the most helpful, eye-opening, or troubling?
2. What are some things that you want to make sure your children and grandchildren know about you?
3. What is something that you would make sure to warn your next door neighbor about? In other words, what would cause you to go next door, knock on your neighbor’s door and warn them about something?

Digging Deeper

4. From Psalm 71:5-6, 17 what can we learn about the author of this Psalm? What would lead you to believe that this Psalm was likely written by David?

5. From verses 9 and 18 what does it seem the author is concerned about?

6. According to verses 8, 14-16, and 22-24 what seems to be the center of the psalmist's life?

7. How does the psalmist hope that God will reward him in verses 13 and 21?

8. How do the issues of old age play into this particular Psalm? (V5-6, 9,17-18)

9. In verses 15-16 the psalmist boasts about some of the wonderful things that God has done in the past. What righteous acts, deeds of salvation, and mighty works might the psalmist be referring to?

10. From verse 14 on, the psalmist states that he desires to share with others all about God's mighty works. List the verses that express the psalmist's desire to tell others about who God is.

11. From verses 14-24 list all the things for which the psalmist wants to praise God.
